20 TAR UC Students Get Financial Aid from Bursary

TWENTY Tunku Abdul Rahman University College (TAR UC) diploma and bachelor degree students from the lower-income group received financial aid totalling RM400,000 at a virtual awards presentation.

The money was from the TAR UC JinBodhi Bursary set up by Bodhi Meditation Malaysia Bhd (BMMB).

This is the fourth time TAR UC and BMMB have come together to provide financial aid to underprivileged students.

From 2017 to 2019, RM2.4mil worth of financial aid had been awarded to 128 recipients.

The representatives from BMMB – Zhi Guang, Ling Shan, Xu Te and committee members – were present at the virtual award presentation ceremony, together with TAR UC president Prof Dr Lee Sze Wei and senior officials of the university college.

In his speech, Ling Shan said he hoped the students would cherish this bursary and study hard to realise their ambitions.

“It is our founder Grandmaster JinBodhi’s humble wish that all young children are given an opportunity to pursue education.

“He believes that education is the key to changing lives, especially that of the next generation, and we hope that the young will obtain better opportunities in education to overcome poverty.”

Prof Lee said, “It has not been easy for the past one year, considering the difficulties we had to go through, but I am proud that this bursary still continues.”
