TUNKU Abdul Rahman University College's (TAR UC) A Level students continue the institution's longstanding tradition of academic excellence when 89 of them emerged as high achievers.

They obtained excellent results in the June 2019 Cambridge GCE A Level and AS Level examinations.

During the June 2019 A Level Awards presentation ceremony, 18 A Level high achievers and 71 AS Level high achievers received award certificates as a form of recognition for their efforts and in celebration of their exceptional achievements.

The June 2019 examinations saw students attaining an outstanding pass percentage of 90% for A Level with 37% of the cohort achieving excellent results of AAB and above.

For individual subject performance, students stood out by scoring exceptional pass percentages for Accounting at 80% and Chemistry at 91%.

What was most impressive was that a 100% passing rate was achieved in five subjects, namely

Biology, Economics, Further Mathematics, Physics and Mathematics.

The AS Level was equally impressive with 51% of the cohort scoring 2As and above, including

23 students who attained a result of 4As and above.

TAR UC president Prof Dr Lee Sze Wei presented the award certificates to the high achievers. He commended them for their

success in achieving an important milestone in their education journey.

"We are always happy to hear news of how well our students have performed in the A Level and AS Level examinations.

"The A Level programme at TAR UC began 32 years ago with only 29 students. It has come a long way since then, and we take pride in ensuring our students always have access to the best learning facilities and teaching staff," said Prof Lee in his speech.

Carmen Khew Ling Lung received the Best Performance in A Level (Science) and the Centre for Pre-University Studies (CPUS) Top Achievement Cup for scoring 4As.

"I would not be standing here if not for the guidance from my lecturers, who have always been there to support and help me learn through fun and creative ways,"

said Khew, who will be furthering her studies in actuarial science.

The Best Performance in A Level (Arts) went to Chin Si Yen, who scored 2As and will soon be reading economics.

"Apart from the financial support provided by TAR UC which eased the burden of my parents, the conducive campus environment and fantastic teaching staff made my experience here one of the most memorable," said Chin.

Meanwhile, Koh Kuan Jian who scored 4As 1B and Chan Jing Hui who obtained 3As 1B were named the AS Level best overall performers in Science and Arts respectively.

TAR UC started offering the A Level programme in 1987 and has produced many outstanding students since then with many gaining admission into top universities.
