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PYDC and Five Educational Institutions Enter MoU to Further Accelerate Youth Empowerment



THE Penang Youth Development Corporation (PYDC) today exchanged the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with five different educational institutions to further strengthen, promote and sharpen soft as well as technical skills among the youths.

The five institutions are the Penang Skills Development Centre (PSDC), UOW Malaysia KDU Penang University College, <u>Tunku Abdul Rahman University College (TARUC PG</u>), Han Chiang University College of Communication and SEGi College Penang.

State Youth and Sports Committee chairman Soon Lip Chee said the partnership with the five institutions is expected to further educate the younger generation on the importance to excel and sharpen soft and technical skills – two areas that are increasingly becoming important in today's era.

"I am glad and truly excited for this collaboration that will see many initiatives flow in from PYDC and other participating institutions for the benefit of the students," Chong said during her speech after signing the MoU.

Meanwhile SEGi College principal Cheah Teong Keat, who was present on behalf of the college to witness the ceremony, expressed the dire need for students to move in line with the developments that the world is experiencing in the area of digitalisation.

"We are living in an era where technology has become a tool to enable employment. Skill sets are what employers want.

"We can no longer equip our students with just academic knowledge, but it can instead be used as a foundation to climb for greater success," he added.
