Underwater Gaya Clean-up

Kota Kinabalu: The Rotary Club of Kinabalu Sutera has initiated an underwater clean-up project at Padong Point in Gaya Island. President Roger Yapp said they collected 50kg of trash from beneath Padong Point.

The community project was co-organised with the Marine Research Foundation, Kota Kinabalu City Hall, Sabah Parks, Tunku Abdul Rahman University of Management and **Technology**, and Trash Hero.

Padong Point, originally a pristine underwater ecosystem, has unfortunately become a dumping ground for residents unaware of its environmental significance, he said. The collected trash, he said, comprising plastic waste, discarded fishing gear, and other debris, posed a threat to marine life and the fragile underwater ecosystem.

He said the club remains committed to community service, striving to keep the environment free from trash. Through collaboration with like-minded organisations and innovative approaches, they have not only tackled a critical issue but have also set an example for others to follow.
