A Global Language for Global Universities? Language in Higher Education

Janina Brutt-Griffler is Professor of Foreign and Second Language Education and Director of Polish Studies in the Division of Transnational Studies at the State University of New York at Buffalo. She has also served in the graduate faculty of three other research universities, most recently at the University of York, England. She is Editor-in-Chief of the *International Journal of Applied Linguistics* (Wiley-Blackwell Publishers). Professor Brutt-Griffler's research focuses on the development of English as a global language, language education, and language policy. In particular, she has been concerned with adducing empirical evidence to investigate the instrumentalities of language spread. Her first book, *World English: A Study of Its Development*, which exposed the myth that English's dominant position today owes to linguistic imperialism, won the Kenneth Mildenberger award from the Modern Language Association of America in 2004. She is also co-editor of *English and Ethnicity* and *Bilingualism and Language Pedagogy* and has published dozens of articles in leading journals. Professor Brutt-Griffler is currently working on two major research projects, a study of language policy in the European Union, with a specific focus on Poland, and the rise of national languages in postcolonial states. At SUNY Buffalo, she teaches graduate seminars in linguistics, sociolinguistics, second language acquisition and academic writing, and mentors numerous doctoral students from the US and around the world.
